



Schedule of Events for Earthquake Awareness Campaign, January 7- 13, 2018

"Preparing for the quake, helps reduce damage after the shakes"

Jamaica's location along the northern margin of the Caribbean Plate and the presence of active faults on the island makes it vulnerable to earthquakes, coupled with the crippling effects of the January 2010 earthquake on Haiti and Jamaica's role in the recovery process, it is quite timely that the nation pause to reflect, share expertise and ensure that we are ready for this type of hazard.

Thus, the Office of Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Management (ODPEM) has created a campaign, to be observed during the month of January 2018 as the Earthquake Awareness Campaign, focusing on earthquake readiness with the Theme "Preparing for the quake, help reduce damage after the shake"

A series of activities have been planned for the quarter with an aim at increasing the general awareness of the Jamaican public of the importance of preparing for an earthquake.
